Just before sitting down to begin writing, I was counting out candles for tiny Advent Wreath kits that will be handed out this Sunday. Advent is here and we are reminded with the wreath and candles of God's never-ending love for us and the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love that is made manifest in our lives through Christ who is the Light of the world.

Do we need all these symbols? Do we need the hymns? The words of the prophets? The sounds and silences of the season? I think we do. God gifts us with multiple experiences to encounter the good news of Christ. We need each opportunity, each method, each note, each message. In these varied ways, our God of the universe touches our lives and hearts and opens us to a greater understanding of the message of saving good news that is a source of great joy for all creation.

Each time we see a five pointed, Bethlehem Star we can notice it's human shape and remember that God came to be with us in Jesus Christ, Emmanuel. With each "Silent Night" we consider the faith of a young woman who trusted in God when confronted with the impossible. Like Mary, our souls magnify the Lord and we sing of our "Joy to the World" as the angels did so long ago.



Connectional Giving...

Connectional Giving helps fund ministries like ...

Clergy Support Fund

The Clergy Support Fund provides funding for the expenses borne by the Florida Conference to sustain, support, hold accountable, and nurture our clergy. Our system of appointed clergy is an essential part of our connectional United Methodist Church.

The Clergy Support Fund is used in the following wavs:

Clergy Benefits and Equitable Compensation - The local church is the primary salary-paying unit for pastors, but the Florida Conference pays a variety of clergy benefits and expenses, including a substantial subsidy for equitable compensation.

Clergy-Related Conference Boards – Pays the meeting and program cost of our Conference Board of Ordained Ministry (BOOM).

Bishop's Office and Residence – Pays the Episcopal office and Episcopal residence expenses which are not paid by the General Church (through the Episcopal Fund).

District superintendents and Cabinet – Pays for the salaries, benefits, and business expenses of our eight district superintendents; and the meeting-related and other costs of the Cabinet.

Judicial Process – Pays for the cost of the conference committee on Investigations and Judicial Procedures, which handles difficult clergy matters. It also pays the Conference's costs related to clergy suspensions during the investigative and judicial process.

This month, one of FUMC's "Happy Holiday Happenings" is the "rebirth" of the Annual Talent Show. Over the vears. under the direction of Bonnie Allen or Pam Wyant, FUMCers and friends showcased

a variety of assorted acts and abilities. After a few years hiatus, and "never saying no to Bonnie", this event returns to the First Methodist stage.

Some twenty years ago, "Christmas Potpourri- Talents and Treats of First Methodist Church of Bartow" featured the dynamic duo of Heath Peterson and Ted Wright as Masters of Ceremonies. They constantly amused the audience with their guips and comments on presenters and their well-known "top ten" lists. (In future years the multitalented Brandon Pickard took his turn as creative show-host.)

ARGENTINA

First Methodist Evangelical Church of Mendoza and **Albert Schweitzer School**

Situation: We are building a relationship with Primera (First) Metodista (Methodist) Evangelica (Evangelical) Iglesia (Church) de (of) Mendoza and Albert Schweitzer Escuela (school), the church's affiliated school. We are fortunate to be working with several people in Argentina who help us understand the cultural nuances between our countries. While we have taken some items to Mendoza, most of what we are doing is getting to know other brothers and sisters in Christ and learning from each other about how we do ministry in our communities.

> Response: First, be in prayer for PMEI de Mendoza and Colegio Albert Schweitzer!

If you would like to share ministry ideas with church ministry leaders, talk to Pastor Missy about how to do that.

If you feel called to give financially, Checks made out to the church should have Argentina on the memo line. We will be having a Missions luncheon in January. Further, please be in prayer over joining a group going in late June

Want something more hands on than money, but not quite hands on all the way to Argentina?

We are collecting sewing notions, including **zippers and** snaps, etc. for the women's sewing group and thumb drives as well as gently used laptops and tablets for the students at Albert Schweitzer. They can be dropped off in the Sanctuary on Sundays or at the church office during the week.

Sister Church in Cuba

Situation: We have a sister church in Cuba! We seek to support the Iglesia Metodista de Santa Cruz with prayer, visits when possible, and financial gifts to help with their ministries. Cuba's economic situation is dire and basic necessities are expensive, much less the small extras that help make ministry easier.

Response: Continue to lift our sister church, Iglesia Metodista de Santa Cruz, in prayer. Make a financial gift through our church with "Cuba Sister Church" on the memo line and/or on the directions on your giving envelope.

EAST ANGOLA

Situation: East Angola is alive with the love of Christ, but the area faces an uphill battle as the country continues to build and rebuild infrastructure after decades of war. Below we listed just some of the ministries that are ongoing in East Angola. Our own Florida Conference is in covenant with East Angola to support ministries through prayer as well as various forms of physical support.

BLESSED TO BE A BLESSING

Our missions and outreach are not simply seasonal. These ministries and more happen year round. Yet in this season of gratitude and anticipation as we prepare our hearts anew for the gift of Christ, it seems especially appropriate to celebrate these ways we are invited to participate in God's glorious way of love and care for all people.

We hope you will be in prayer for these ministries throughout the year.

JACKETS AND BLANKETS

Situation: As the colder months approach, many children and adults will find last year's jacket is gone or too small. These last months have meant choosing to buy food or clothes for many. People who are working, on fixed incomes, or living on the margins for many reasons are finding it difficult to buy necessities, much less a blanket or coat that has become a luxury. Those of you with families know that children often need a new coat every year!

Response: Through the end of January, you are invited to bring in NEW OR GENTLY USED jackets and **blankets** and place your items in the basket provided in the Sanctuary. Everything brought in will be distributed in our area.

SOCKS AND UNDERWEAR

Situation: We have families and individuals in our area who do not have a permanent home. They might stay in a hotel or with family/ friends for a short time and then relocate. Many of them don't have the opportunity to wash their clothes regularly. This leads to poor health conditions. Even if they have to wear their other clothes for longer periods, with new socks and underwear people can stay healthier! Studies have even shown that foot health leads to less ER visits in homeless populations.

Response: Bring new socks and underwear of any size to the sanctuary and place them in the giant stockings marked sock OR underwear, as appropriate! Pray for those who do not always know where they will lay their heads.

LUNCH FOODS

Situation: With inflation, the cost of living has caused a lot of families to have difficulty getting the food they need. Many have suffered other material losses because of storms, health. or other situations. The Bartow Church Service Center provides bag lunches for the needy daily as well as other lunch foods to families and others in need who come by. Our church also creates a few small bags to keep on hand for emergency needs.

Response: Be in prayer and bring in nonperishable lunch foods such as peanut butter, jelly, fruit cups, protein or breakfast bars.

ZOE Empowers DISTRICT PARTNERSHIP WITH **TOGETHERNESS GROUP OF RWANDA**

Situation: Due to the AIDs epidemic, war and violence, COVID, and other reasons many children are orphaned in Africa. Family members,

friends, and villages do what they can, but many orphans are left to fend for themselves through panhandling or day labor. They are often also taking care of younger siblings. 

As many of you know, with our help, our Sister Church in Cuba, Santa Cruz del Sur, has been working on getting their church roof repaired. It looks like they are ready to start the repair, but desperately need our prayers. They have located the people who will sell the roof shingles. Additionally the same people will transport them. They also have the person who will install them. However, because of the political situation in Cuba, even something as simple as having a roof put on is difficult.

Please also keep them in prayer since they have had no running water for the last couple of weeks. The government run water system lost a pump motor that feeds part of Santa Cruz del Sur and the government is not responding to the broken motor.
