

Administrative and Ministry Chairs, budgets will be due by Oct 2. Watch for budget planning information to be sent soon from Finance. Thank you!


Charge Conference is Oct 8. We are a host church!

So many beautiful ministries. Why do we do them?

Because despite the heat, despite the difficulties of some days, we are called to care for and feed the sheep of this world. The truth is sometimes we are the sheep ourselves, even as we also act as shepherds. Care and feeding is the comfort of Worship through song, proclaiming of the Good News of Christ, prayer, and sacraments. It is Bibles Studies, meals together, visits, cards, and phone calls. It is outreach that shares the love of Christ through food with Kathy Wood; a ministry of presence at Friday Fest; and by supporting the many mercy ministries of Bartow Church Service Center and the justice ministries of PEACE. It is being a part of the loving will of God at work in the world through missions with medical supplies to Cuba; helping children take hold of their God-given talents to thrive in a supportive Christian community in Rwanda;

supporting missionaries and doctors so that people can learn about Christ, be healthy, regain sight, and grow food in East Angola; and a church and school in Mendoza with whom we share ideas, prayers, and friendship.

All of this is why even in the heat of Summer we continue ministries and seek ways to feed those hungry for the good news and thirsty for the living water that are life in Christ. And now as Fall approaches, we glorify God for all the wondrous ways we are offered to participate in God's amazing grace in the world. We can negotiate whatever heat the world brings because God is with us and empowers us for these ministries. Rooted deeply in Christ, individually and as a church family we continue to flourish with the Holy Spirit's guidance.

On Sunday, August 27th we will celebrate Laity Sunday. We will praise God for the ministries of this church and thank God for all those who have responded to God's call to love and serve. We will bless those who share their gifts in ways that bless others. We will offer praise and thanksgiving for all that God has given us to do this impossibly possible work. ...and then in good Methodist fashion, we will eat! Hope you can join us in person or in spirit!

ACROSS THE COURTYARD

In recent FUMC
Newsletters and FUMC
bulletins notice has
been made of plans for
an "interim in-house directory". A suggestion
was made that contributors take a selfie with a
backdrop of one of our
beautiful stained glass

windows. Our church history relates that in 1978 Richard Beasley of Beasley's Stained Glass in Apopka wrote... "These windows are a beautiful example of stained glass style of the turn of the Century and are priceless antiques in that artwork. The glass they contain can not be duplicated. They should treated with the same respect accorded with any work of art that can not be replaced."

All of the original donors of the windows were prominent in the early history of our church and the city of Bartow. Their legacy continued with future generations of our church family and beyond.

"If these windows could talk..."

Vestiges of these "Stained glass saints" could be found in Bartow streets (Carpenter, Wilson, Hooker...) Parks (Jordan, Holland...), Buildings (Mann, E. A. Law, Civic Center...), Department Stores (Macys...) and even the Governor's mansion (Holland).

....But those are other stories...

One of the windows that is especially "close to the heart" of some of our current FUMCers is inscribed "In memoriam... Charles E. Earnest, Sr. and is highlighted with the figure of Jesus as he uplifts his serene face to heaven. The right side In memoriam Sarah L. Earnest... is adorned with several stems of wheat. They were the parents of Charles Earnest, who was very active in First Methodist from the time of his arrival in Bartow with (his wife) until he relocated to West Palm Beach in 1936. Mrs. Earnest was also engaged in the Women's work of the church. (Earnest) relatives included Jesse Sutton Timberlake, Adele Timberlake Bevis, Elsa Sutton Wilson and her daughters, Harriet and Elsa (Huff). Another relative was

Audrey Timberlake Taylor and her daughter, Vicki Taylor Sweet."

...So whether your "selfie setting" contains one of these glorious stained glass windows or your own personal "place of radiance" sharing your beauty with others in our congregation will be a much loved contribution to our "in-house directory" and your Bartow First United Methodist family.

6 rulers, 7 packs of crayons,7 glues, 20 glue sticks, 12 portfolio folders, 76 pencils, 12 colored pencils, 10 3 ring binders,13 highlighters, 10 pens, 3 erasers, 4 safety scissors, 4 backpacks, 10 mechanical pencils, 11 spiral bound notebooks, 4 3 subject spiral bound notebooks, 11 packs of paper, 4 writing pads, and 8 pocket folders.

Altogether over 200 items will be donated for the Back to School Event!

We are now officially partners with the "Togetherness" group in Rwanda!

Through ZOE Empowers and with other UM Churches in the Gulf-Central District, we have partnered with orphans in Rwanda to have healthy, self-sufficient, and community oriented lives centered in Christ!

Translated as 'Togetherness," our group is made up of 76 children in Rwanda.

To partner with our group and with other churches in our District, we needed to raise \$125.

We offered our children at Vacation Bible School the opportunity to get the ball rolling with one of their Mission days.

Our children brought in \$100.58!.

The church family was then challenged to finish what VBS started. We not only were able to send our \$125 to become official partners, we even have a little bit left over for any special projects we might hear that our Togetherness group
